Having accepted the call to become a disciple and to help others become disciples, we begin to understand what we don't know. Or rather we embrace what we have to learn. Sometimes we get the impression that the end of faith is that initial yes to Jesus.

As important as that confession is, it is only the beginning of the path to becoming a disciple. Paul, in the twelfth chapter of his wonderful letter to the Romans, invites us to embrace transformation so that we can know the will of God for our lives and for the world. He tells us that this takes place, at least in part, through the "renewing of your minds." (Romans 12:2 NRSV) "2 Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect."

So, let us consider together today what it means to be a disciple. Let's embrace the truth, even when it is difficult and takes effort, even when we learn of the commitment that is involved in following Jesus. Because we also discover the joy in serving and loving and working for justice.

It may be hard, and we may mess up at times, or lose focus, but we're learning and we're growing. Becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ isn't an instantaneous event, but a lifelong process. Wesley called it sanctification, this process of becoming more like Christ, and acknowledged that it is a journey. But we're on the way, or as Wesley claimed, moving on to perfection in love. There's a lot to learn as we grow. But together we will be all that much stronger...
