Opening Meditation

Here we are, once again, at the cusp of a change in the season. Today we celebrate The Transfiguration of Jesus Christ as we move from Epiphany into Lent. Thus, today is a day of growing pains and crossing thresholds instigated by the shock of coming face-to-face with glory.

In many ways, we start and end this season after Epiphany with revelations of Jesus' fully divine and fully human nature. What we first encounter at the waters of baptism is further revealed in the Transfiguration.

The season of Epiphany is framed by light, and here on this Transfiguration Sunday the light is revealed, is given. Like the three disciples in that moment, we don't always know what to do with it, how to respond to it. But we know we want it; we want to dwell in it. We want that light to remove all the darkness from our lives. So, let us celebrate the light. Follow the light. Embrace the light.

Today let our worship bring forth the light. For the presence of Jesus is in our midst. Come, let us shine the light of His glory in our hour of praise and worship!

A Call to Worship

2 Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, 3 and his clothes became dazzling bright, such as no one[a] on earth could brighten them. 4 And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. 5 Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us set up three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." 6 He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. 7 Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved;[b] listen to him!" 8 Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.

9 As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.
