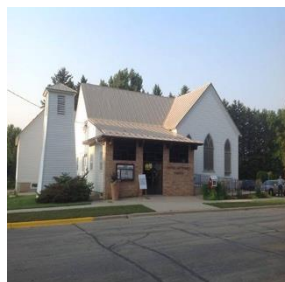

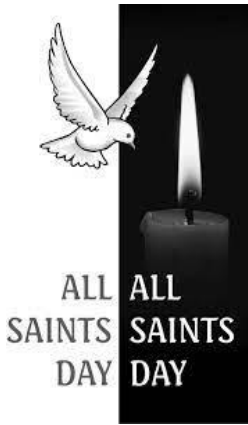

**November 3, 2024**

All Saints Day is one of those moments where we celebrate and remember those who have made the journey or who have taken the next step. We remember them because they are still a part of us, shaping us, mentoring us – maybe not in a direct way, but in a real way. John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement, enjoyed and celebrated All Saints Day. In a journal entry from November 1, 1767, Wesley calls it "a festival I truly love." On All Saints Day, we recognize that we are part of a giant choir singing the same song. It is the song Jesus taught his disciples; a tune that has resonated for more than 2,000 years; a melody sung in glory and on the earth. Our great privilege is to add our voices to this chorus.



**November 10, 2024**

Today Jesus is asking us to keep a vision of the kin-dom before us always, to look beyond this moment—for good or for all—and see what God has in store for creation. We are not asked to ignore the moment; this isn't a call to pie-in-the-sky blindness. Instead, we live in this moment; we work in this moment, because we know what is coming; we know the promise and that gives us courage to keep going forward, even when it seems as if we are hitting a wall and not accomplishing anything. We worship a God of peace when there is no peace. We act as brothers and sisters of one loving family, even when we are divided and filled with hate.

Our Gospel reading today is not an easy one. You see, Jesus did not hesitate to talk of the end times. And as a matter of fact, in addition to what we have from Jesus today, we also acknowledge that God called on John to give him a vision to write what we know as Revelation. The truth of the end times is not mere speculation, but has an intensely practical purpose to strengthen, reassure, and nerve believers as we face the impending woes. Better that we know that something is coming than to be caught unaware. Right?

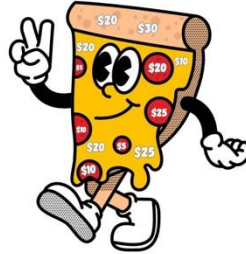

**to be led by Bishop Lanette Plambeck**

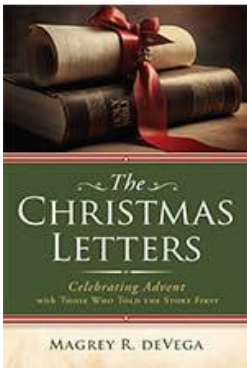

You may or may not know the story of your birth. If you do, there is something special about hearing your origin story again and remembering how it all began for you. That’s why we observe Advent: to celebrate how it all began for us.

In *The Christmas Letters*, Magrey deVega invites you to hear about the miracle of Christ’s birth from those who first told the story. The letters in the New Testament, known as the Epistles, contain the first attempts by the church to understand and celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation.

They point us to the origins of what we believe about Jesus, fully human and fully divine. By spending time with these holy, ancient words this Advent, you’ll come to know the meaning of Christ’s coming like never before.

Together we will read the New Testament letters, Romans, 1 John, Philipians, and Colossians as our Christmas letters of the season and find within them an invitation from God to deepen our understanding of the Incarnation and embrace a fuller commitment to Jesus Christ
