

Racine UMC Parking Lot Worship Service Protocol

As the United Methodist Church, it is important for us to service our neighbor while we honor the traditions we observe as a worshiping and serving community of faith. We are commanded by our Methodist beliefs that:

We are people that **do no harm**. We practice physical distancing to minimize harm to others, especially the vulnerable among us.

We are people that **do all the good we can.** We care for the spiritual and physical needs of our neighbors, providing food, emotional support, and supporting our health care system.

We are people that **stay in love with God**. When we love God through prayer, praise, and worship, we grow in love of our neighbor. Love of God and love of neighbor are inseparable.

With these principles in mind, we have established these procedures to help us gather in worship at Racine UMC.

- All vehicles are asked to enter via Main Street and Exit only via Oak Ave.
- Only fully enclosed vehicles will be allowed for the protection of all participants, this means no JD gators or golf carts unless fully enclosed.
- Car windows are always to remain up and have enough masks in the vehicle for all occupants in the event that personal contact is needed for safety reasons only.
- People will always stay in their cars before/during/after worship and listen to service via their FM radio
 - Vehicles will be spaced at a minimum of 4-6ft apart
- The entire Church building will remain locked and no one will be allowed entry, this means that church restrooms will not be available for use. If a member of your car needs a restroom, we ask that you carefully exit the parking lot using the marked exit and head home to use your personal facility.
 - Children's moments will be part of worship service, but we ask that children stay in their vehicles, however, children's church will not be provided during worship until pandemic threat has ended

To register at your polling place on Election Day, bring one proof of residence listed below.

- Valid Minnesota driver's license, learner's permit or ID; or a receipt for any of these.
- Tribal ID with name, address, photo and signature.

(2) PHOTO ID PLUS A DOCUMENT WITH YOUR CURRENT NAME AND ADDRESS

Choose one. Can be expired.

Driver's license, state ID or learner's permit issued by any state

U.S. Passport

U.S. Military or Veteran ID

Tribal ID with name, signature and photo

Minnesota university, college or technical college ID

Minnesota high school ID

Approved documents

Choose one. Can be shown on electronic device.

Bill, account or start-of-service statement due or dated within 30 days of the election for:

- * Phone, TV or internet
- * Solid waste, sewer, electric, gas or water
- * Banking or credit card
