Opening Meditation

As we continue our journey of faith, the question today is this: are we called to look for signs of God's presence or are we called to be a sign of God's presence? The answer, as you might expect, is yes! We are the ones who are trying to be tuned into God's wavelength, listening to God's broadcast. Therefore, we must look for the signs that God is at work in and around us always.

Today let our prayer time not just call for God to act around us, but to give thanks for the activity that is already happening.

Remember, we are more than passive observers. We are active presenters, active signs of God's presence in the world. Today let us gather to once again commit ourselves to presenting the goodness of God in the world around us each day.

Set them at tasks which demand their best efforts and lead them to accomplishments which satisfy and delight. Let them not take failures and disappointments as a measure of their worth but as opportunities for new learning and new beginnings. Open their hearts to life and their minds to learning. Let Holy Wisdom be their companion.

Send your holy angels to stand guard and keep watch over all students and teachers. Let their names be always on the lips of your saints in prayer. Bless and keep them. Let your face shine upon them. Be gracious to them. Lift up your countenance upon them and give them peace.

Accept and bless these backpacks and all that are throughout our community to be for those who carry them a sign of your and our love, support, and presence.
